The Destructive Power of "Talents" that Have No Connection to the Holy Spirit

1846 Nitroglycerine created by Ascanio Sabrero

1860 Alfred Nobel began work on a chemical to make Nitroglycerine safe

Nobel succeeded in creating "diatomaceous earth" (Kieselguhr) that

stabilized Nitroglycerine and made it safe to use.

*As powerful as Nitroglycerine was, it wasn't until it was mixed with Kieselguhr that it became "safe" to use. It had to first be combined with a "stabilizing agent" before it became useful.

 Not what we feel or prefer, but in the Will of God and the Message of Jesus Christ.
Not swayed by what others may say, think, or do. The only matter of an Absolute Conviction is and God.
